

- 3 One of the Five Civilized Tribes. (starts with S)
- 4 An area that covers what is now Oklahoma, and parts of Kansas and Nebraska.
- 5 One of the Five Civilized Tribes. (starts with Cho)
- 10 This started when in 1835 when the Seminoles refused to leave Florida.
- 12 A Cherokee leader who opposed any treaty that made Cherokees move west.
- 13 One of the Five Civilized Tribes. (starts with Che)
- 14 A Cherokee who invented a writing system for the Cherokee Nation.
- 16 This called for the government to negotiate treaties that would require Native Americans to relocate west.
- 17 Route the Cherokees were forced to travel from Georgia to Indian Territory.
- 20 Law that required Native Americans to move west.
- 21 Seminole who was an important leader in Second Seminole War.

- 2 A General who rounded up about 16,000 Cherokees in 1838 and forced them into camps.
- 5 One of the Five Civilized Tribes. (starts with Chi)
- 6 A Cherokee newspaper.
- 7 Area that is now Oklahoma and parts of Kansas and Nebraska to which Native Americans were moved.
- 8 He resisted being moved west. On the way to the stockade he and his sons fought US soldiers and fled to the Great Smoky Mountains.
- 9 Jackson considered Native Americans to be this.
- 11 US President that chose to ignore a Supreme Court ruling that stated that Georgia taking Cherokee lands was unconstitutional.
- 12 Supreme Court justice who ruled that only the federal government, not the states, could make laws governing the Cherokees.
- 15 The Seminoles led by Osceola hid in this area of Florida. From there they launched suprise attacks against the US Government.
- 18 One of the Five Civilized Tribes. (starts with Cr)
- 19 This was found on Cherokee land in Georgia in 1828.
