

- 14 In late October of 1804 they reached the Mandan Indian in what is now this US State.
- 15 Nationality of Sacagawea's husband.
- 17 Jefferson offered to buy this port city from France.
- 19 An 1803 land purchase from France, which gave the United States the port of New Orleans and doubled the size of the country.
- 20 This river leads out to the Pacific Ocean.
- 21 France offered to sell this huge tract of land to the United States.

- 1 Lewis and Clark traded with the Shoshone to get these. They rode them across the Rocky Mountains.
- 2 Explorer chosen to lean an expedition into the Louisiana Territory.
- 5 An army officer who led an expedition into the southern part of the Louisiana Territory.
- Third President of the United States. He personally trained Lewis in geography, mineralogoy, and astronomy.
- 7 Ten-mile-long series of waterfalls on the Missouri.
- 8 A skilled mapmaker and outdoorsman chosen to explore the Louisiana Territory.
- 10 Clark's African-American slave. His hunting skills won him many admirers mon the Native Americans.
- 11 The gateway to the West. Lewis and Clark spent the winter there in 1803 and 1804.
- 12 A Shoshone woman whose language skills and knowledge of geography helped Louis and Clark.
- 16 Canoes made from hollowed out tree trunks.
- 18 A Shoshone Chief recognized Sacagaea because she was this relation to him.
