

- 6 In 1853 Mexico sold a strip of land in what is now New Mexico and Arizona. This land was needed for a transcontinental railroad.
- 8 Texas claimed this river was its southern boundary.
- 9 The United States shared the Oregon Territory with this country.
- 10 He won the presidential election of 1844. The 11th U.S. President.
- 15 Mexico claimed this river was Texas' southern boundary.
- 16 This General's army captured New Mexico without firing a shot.
- 17 This General landed in Veracruz and eventually captured Mexico City.
- 18 Zachary Taylor's soldiers defeated Santa Ana's forces at this battle.

- 1 He was sent by Polk to buy Texas, California, and New Mexico from Mexico but his efforts failed.
- 2 A belief that the United States was destined to stretch across the continent from the Atlantic to the Pacific.
- 3 Mexico recognized that Texas was part of the United States. Mexico also ceded the Mexican Cession.
- 4 This party nominated James Polk to be president.
- 5 In addition to Texas, the United States gained land in the South West.
- 7 A candidate that received unexpected support. Polk was the first one.
- 11 This newspaper editor coined the term "Manifest Destiny."
- 12 John C Fremont rebelled against Mexican rule in California.
- 13 This appeared on the flag of the Republic of California.
- 14 Winfield Scott's soldiers met fierce resistance at this castle, but eventually the Mexican troops were defeated and Mexico City was captured.
