
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World War I Begins Crossword Puzzle

- 4 Area between two opposing armies.
- 5 Made up of Austria-Hungary, Germany, the Ottoman Empire, and Bulgaria.
- 6 Fighting from protected ditches.
- 9 A peace treaty that withdrew Russia from the war. It was signed in March of 1918.
- 11 Formal agreements or treaties between two or more nations to cooperate for specific purposes like defense.
- 13 A British invention that smashed through barbed wire, crossed trenches, and cleared paths through No Man's Land.
- 16 Devotion and loyalty to one's own country; patriotism.
- 18 In April of 1917 President Wilson urged Congress to take this action.
- 19 In World War I pilots took to the air flying these.
- 23 Staying out and not taking a side in a war.
- 24 An aviator who had downed five or more enemy aircraft.
- 26 Fought between July and November of 1916 and resulted in 1.2 million casualties.
- 27 A British passenger ship that was sunk by a German U-Boat in May of 1915.
- 28 Guns that can fire 600 bullets per minute.

- 1 Germany agreed to President Wilson's demand to stop this. Germany stopped temporarily, but then resumed it again.
- 2 Message proposing an alliance between Germany and Mexico.
- 3 US President during World War I.
- 7 He was shot and killed by a Serbian Nationalist on June 28th, 1914.
- 8 Soldiers had to wear a mask to protect them from this.
- 10 British and French stopped the German advance in September of 1914 during this battle.
- 12 He was forced to step down as Czar of Russia in March of 1917.
- 14 Leader of the Bolsheviks.
- 15 A communist group that overthrew the Czar and took control of Russia in 1917.
- 17 The policy of extending the rule or authority of an empire or nation over foreign countries.
- 20 Germany's top flying ace, Manfred von Richthofen. He shot down over 80 enemy planes.
- 21 Made up of Serbia, Russia, France, Great Britain, Italy, and seven other countries.
- 22 The belief that a country needs a large military force.
- 25 Well-armed German submarines.
