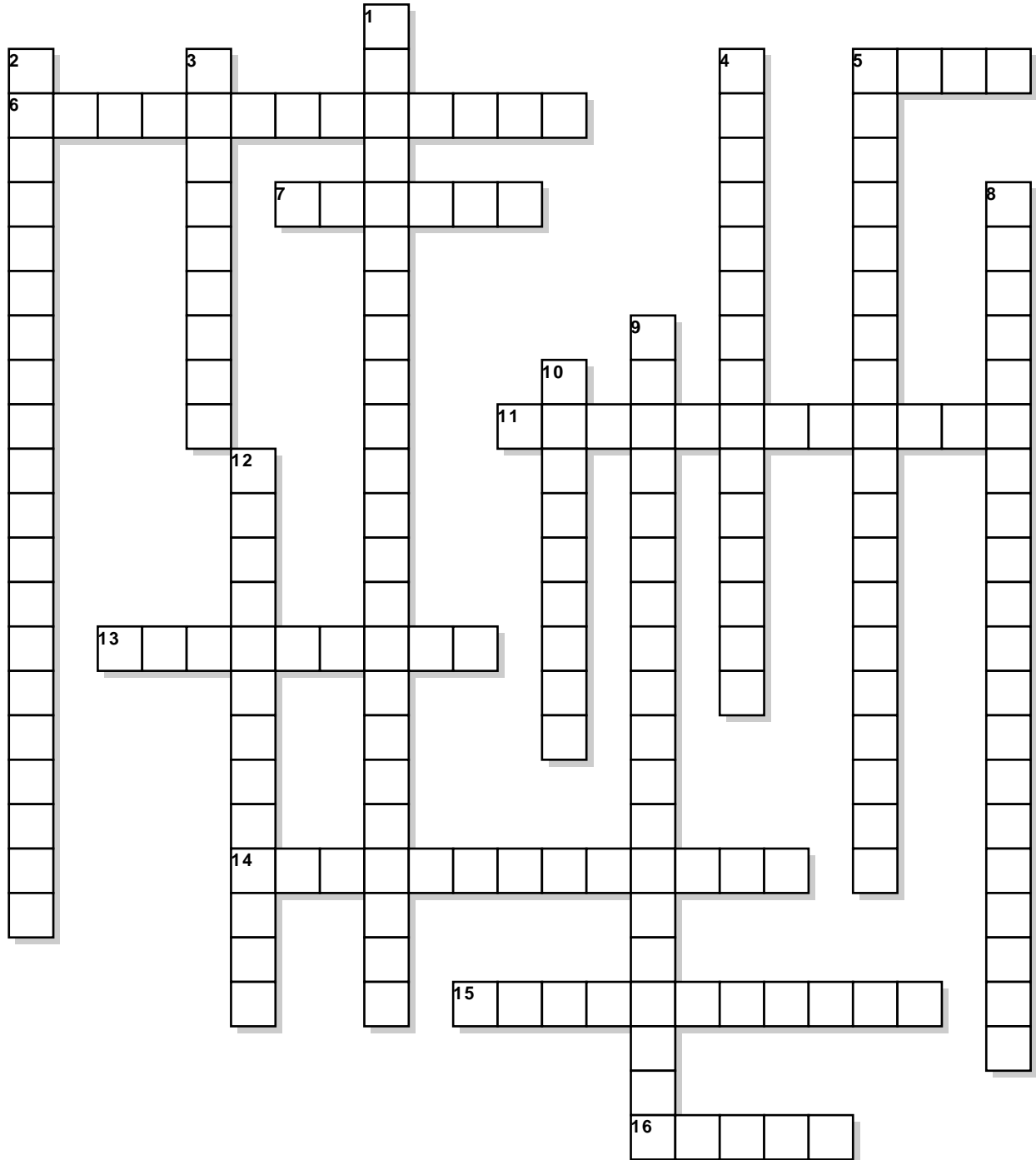


Conflict Over State's Rights Crossword Puzzle
