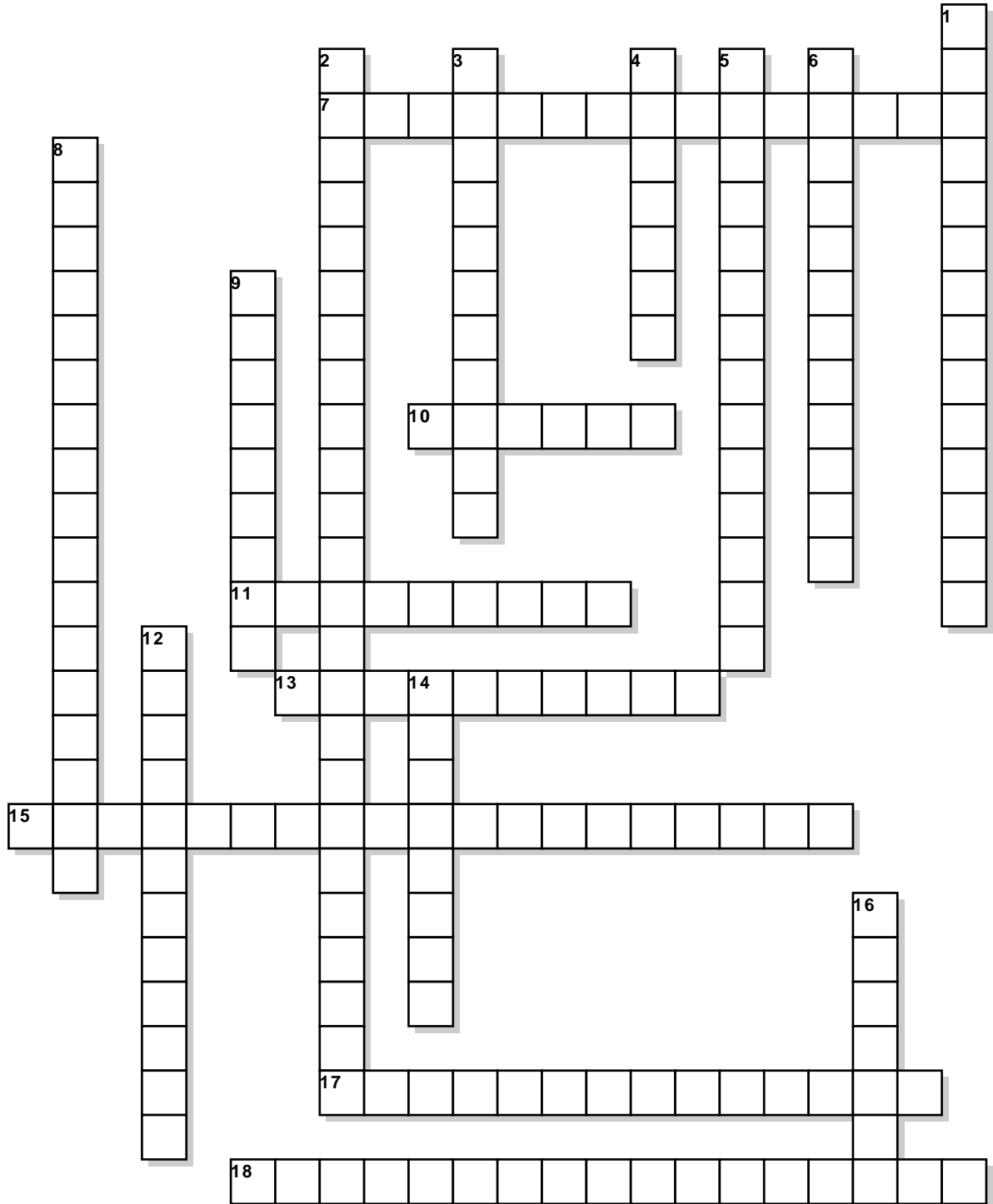


Road To Lexington and Concord Crosswords

- 7 Laws passed by Parliament punishing Massachusetts.
- 10 One provision of the Intolerable Acts closed the port of this city.
- 11 A colonist who could be ready to fight at a minute's notice.
- 13 He was a messenger for the Sons of Liberty spreading news about British troop movements. He was made famous by a poem by Henry Wadsworth Longfellow.
- 15 Sites of the first battles of the Revolutionary War.
- 17 Another Sons of Liberty messenger. He made it all the way to Concord to tell news of British troop movements.
- 18 Parliament appointed him governor of Massachusetts.

- 1 The Intolerable Acts were passed as a reaction to this event.
- 2 Meeting held by the colonies in Philadelphia in 1774 to decide what to do about the problems with Britain.
- 3 He headed the Committee of Safety, which had the power to call out the militia.
- 4 A colonist who supported the colonial rebels.
- 5 If one lantern burned in the steeple of this building, the British were coming by land. Two lanterns meant they were coming by water.
- 6 He said, "I know what course others may take. But as for me, give me liberty or give me death."
- 8 He led around 70 militiamen at Lexington, Massachusetts on April 19th, 1775
- 9 He called the First Continental Congress, "A Nursery of American Statesman."
- 12 Another Sons of Liberty messenger spreading news about British troop movements.
- 14 A colonist who was loyal to Britain.
- 16 A force of armed civilians who pledge to defend their community.
