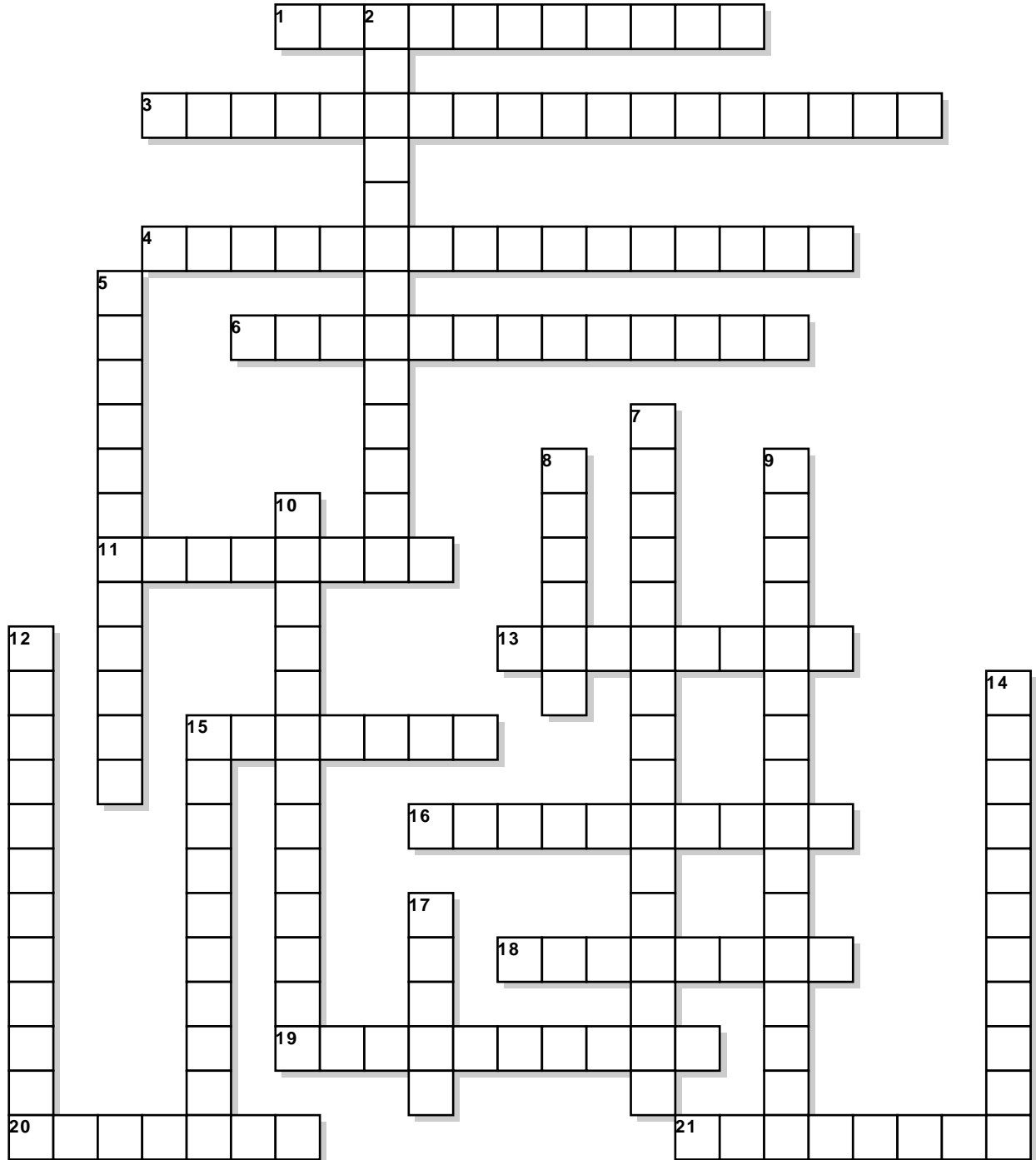


The Texas Revolution

- 1 Stephen Austin's father.
- 3 Sam Houston and his 800 men defeated Santa Ana and his troops.
- 4 In 1836, Texans defended a church called the Alamo against the Mexican army; all but five Texans were killed.
- 6 Settlers were required to become citizens of Mexico and members of this church.
- 11 The Spanish established these to convert Native Americans to Christianity.
- 13 The Mexican president.
- 15 Mexico outlawed this in 1829.
- 16 The leader of the Tejanos during the Texas Revolution. Later falsely accused of planning rebellion against the Lone Star Republic.
- 18 A famous frontiersman who helped defend the Alamo. He has a knife named after him.
- 19 The Alamo is in this city.
- 20 People of Spanish heritage who consider Texas their home.
- 21 Mexican troops were sent there to seize a cannon.

- 5 Texas has natural ports on this body of water.
- 7 The name of the independent nation of Texas.
- 8 Santa Ana ordered his troops to execute 300 Texans here.
- 9 One of the survivors of the Alamo ordered to tell the story of the Alamo to other Texans.
- 10 Leader of the Texans who were defending the Alamo.
- 12 20th century illustrator, Frederick Yohn, depicts him using his rifle as a club.
- 14 They were unable to attract Spanish settlers.
- 15 He was the commander of the Texas army. Elected the first president of Republic of Texas.
- 17 The Spanish name for Texas.
