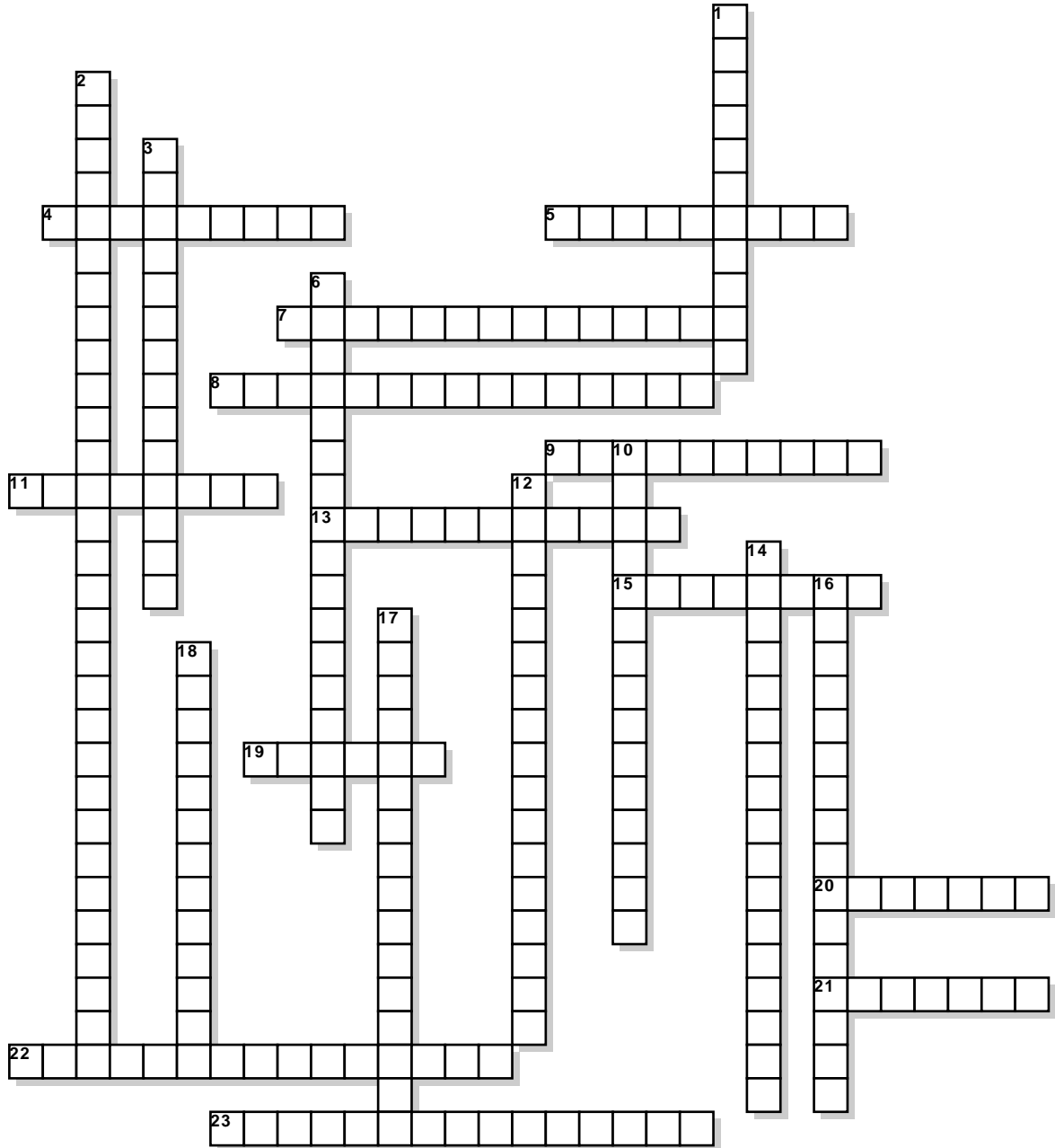


The English 13 Colonies
