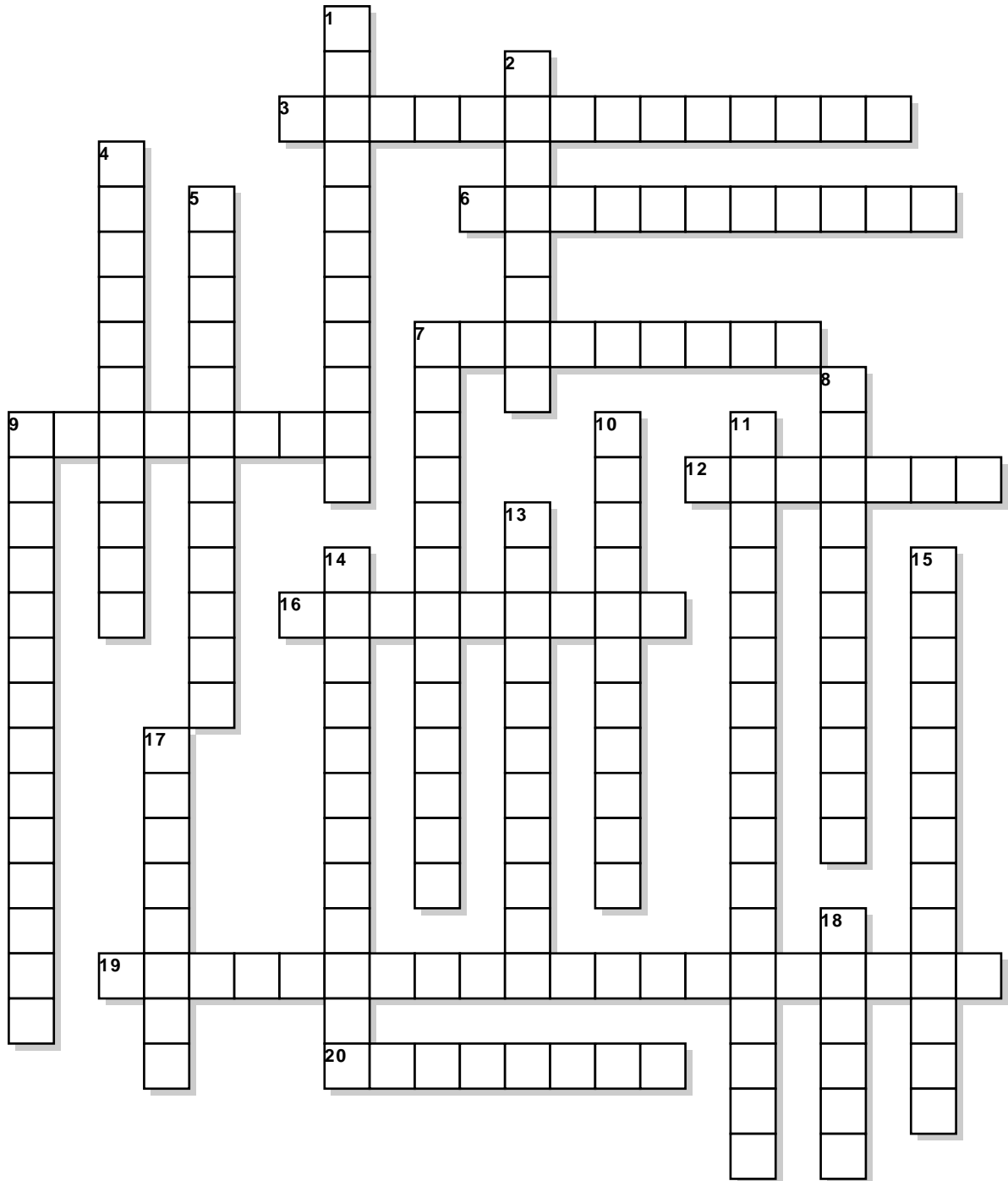


Moving West 1860-1900
