
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Lord of the Flies Crossword Puzzle

- 2 This causes us to have morality, law, and culture.

- 7 A shy, sensitive boy. He represents a kind of natural goodness, as opposed to the unbridled evil of Jack and the imposed morality of civilization represented by Ralph and Piggy.
- 8 The name given to the sow's head that Jack's gang impales on a stake and erects in the forest as an offering to the "beast." It comes to symbolize primordial chaos and terror.
- 11 The boys go hunting for boars (pigs) in this.
- 14 A pair of twins closely allied with Ralph. They are always together and are part of the group known as the "bigguns."

- 17 The novel's protagonist. The twelve year old English boy who is elected leader. Represents human beings' civilizing instinct.
- 18 Piggy really needs these. They are a symbol of the power of science and intellectual endeavors.

- 1 Jack and his followers like to spend their time doing this.
- 2 This group votes for Jack to be their leader.
- 3 Ralph's "lieutenant." A whiny, intellectual boy, His inventiveness frequently leads to innovation, such as the makeshift sundial that the boys use to tell time. He represents the scientific, rational side of civilization.
- 4 This causes us to have anarchy, savage bloodlust, the desire for power, amorality, selfishness, and violence.
- 6 The author of the Lord of the Flies.
- 8 The imaginary monster that frightens all the boys. It stands for the primal instinct of savagery that exists within all human beings. It is really dead pilot and his parachute.
- 9 Functions as a kind of measurement of the strength of the civilized instinct remaining on the island.
- 10 Jack and his followers hunt with these.
- 11 The novel's antagonist and one of the older boys stranded on the island. He becomes the leader of the hunters but longs for total power and becomes increasingly wild, barbaric, and cruel.
- 12 The boys splash and play here.
- 13 Simon has a connection to this.
- 15 A powerful symbol of civilization and order.
