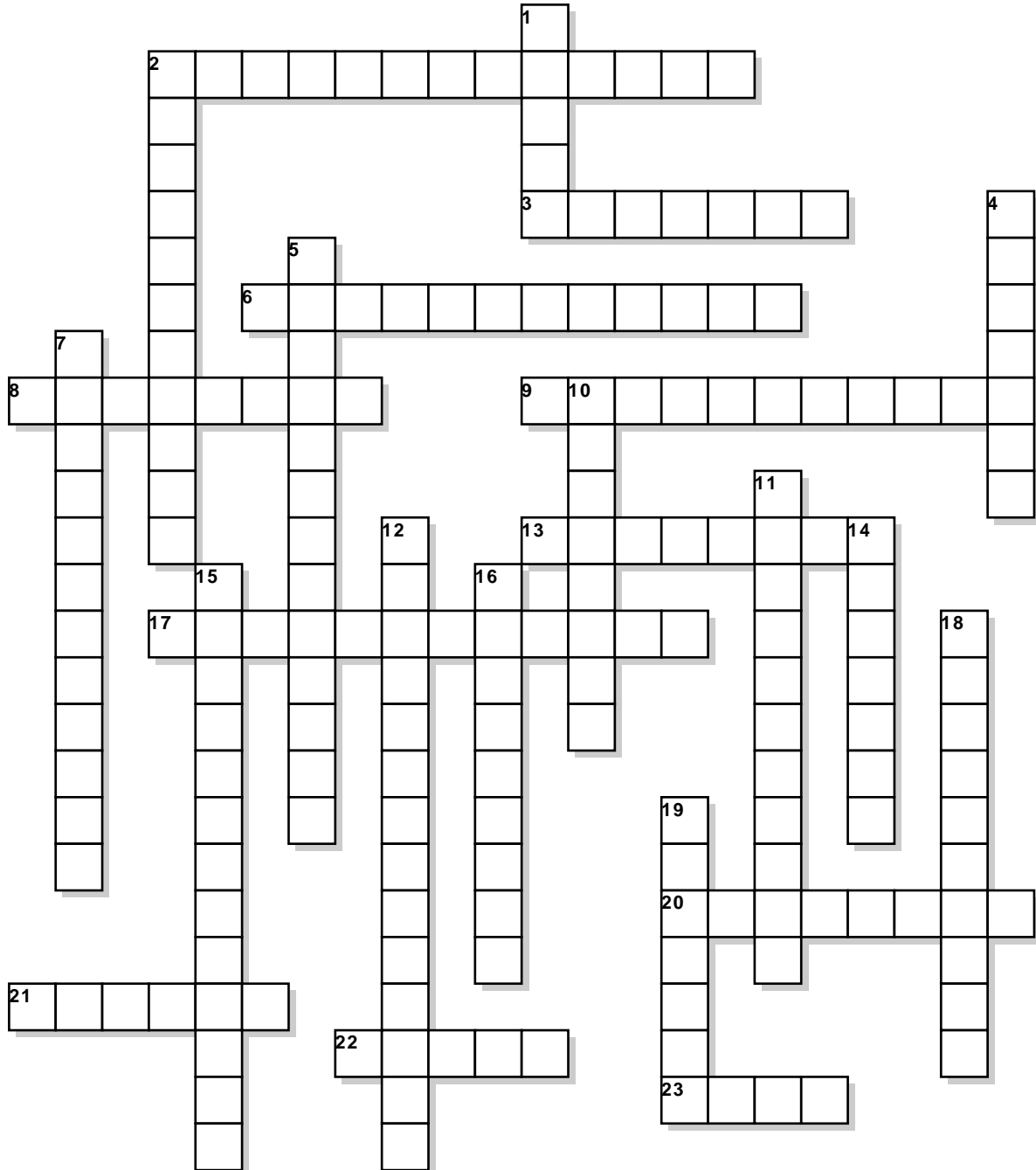


# Crossing Into The Americas



**Across**

- 2 Early Native Americans (ex. Adena and Hopewell) who built large earthen structures.
- 3 A way of life shared by people with similar arts, beliefs, and customs.
- 6 A hairy ancestor of the elephant, now extinct.
- 8 Moved.
- 9 An 800 room Pueblo Bonito was built there. Located in present day New Mexico.
- 13 A bridge of land that was exposed during the last ice age where the Bering Strait is now.
- 17 A mound built in present day Ohio possibly by the Adena, Fort Ancient, or Hopewell cultures.
- 20 Gatherings of food crops usually during the fall.
- 21 A time of extreme cold that lasted for thousands of years.
- 22 Corn.
- 23 They built pyramids, had an accurate yearly calendar, and created a number system using zero.

- 1 Set up a network of trade routes in Mesoamerica. Constructed earthen mounds shaped like pyramids.
- 2 A region that stretches from central Mexico to present day Nicaragua.
- 4 A large busy city built by the Olmec.
- 5 The practice of taming animals to meet human needs.
- 7 An advanced state of human society, in which a high level of culture, science, industry, and government has been achieved.
- 10 A mound building tribe that lived in the Midwest from 400 B.C. to A.D. 400.
- 11 Farming.
- 12 A mound building tribe that lived from A.D. 800 to 1700 and built cities like Cahokia in present day Illinois.
- 14 Lived in the area where Utah, Arizona, Colorado, and New Mexico now meet beginning in A.D. 100.
- 15 A scientist who studies the human past by examining the things people left behind.
- 16 Tools and other objects that humans made.
- 18 The practice of carrying or delivering water to crops.
- 19 Lived in what is now Arizona from about 300 B.C. to A.D. 1400.
