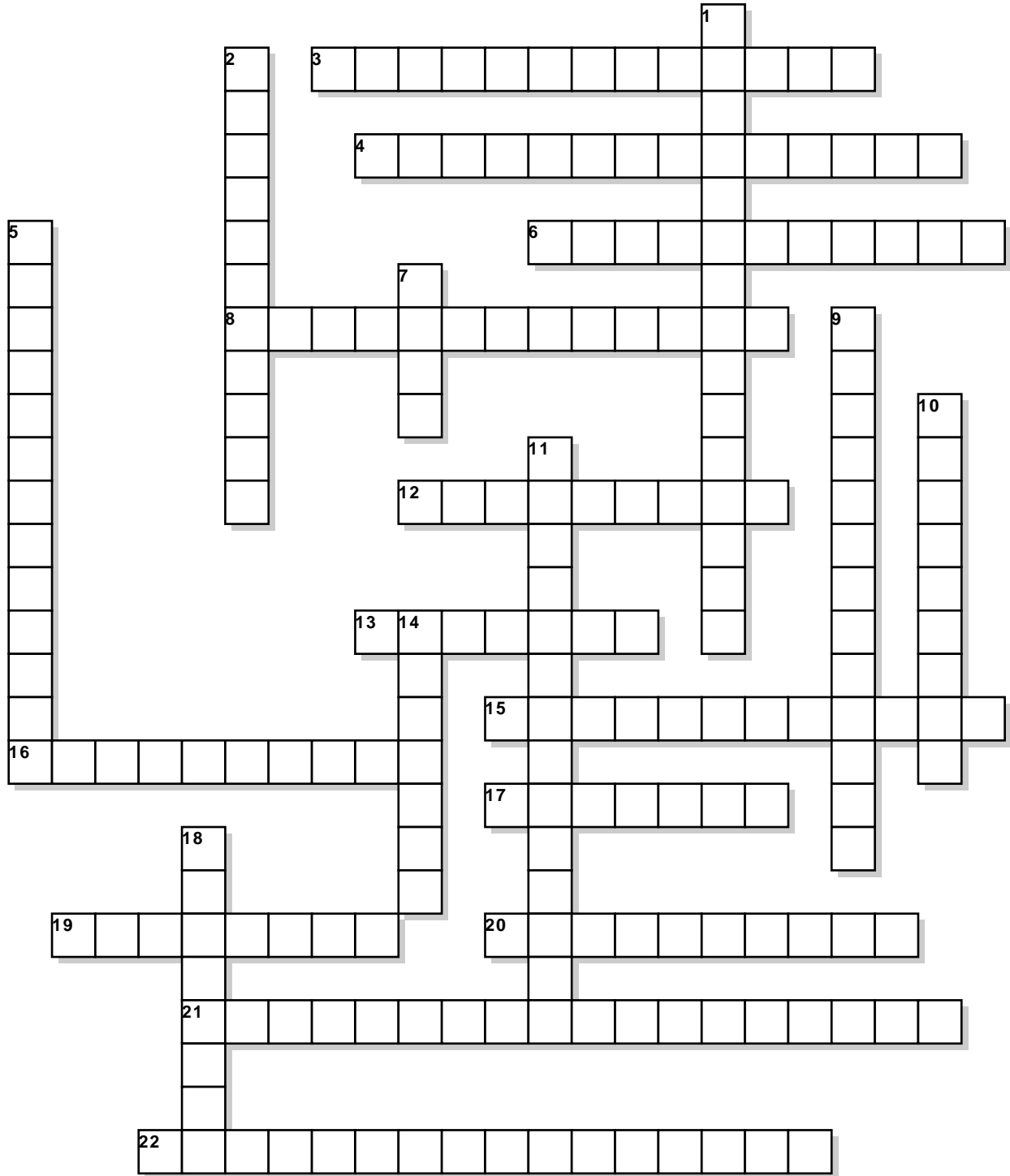


# Britain Tightens Control Crossword Puzzle
