
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Colonial Resistance Crossword Puzzle

- 10 An organized protest that involves people not buying products from specific stores, merchants, or companies.
- 11 During this protest, hundreds of chests of tea were dumped into Boston Harbor.
- 13 A British General that arrived in Boston in 1768 with 1,000 British soldiers.
- 14 Another name for British soldiers.
- 16 This was a nickname for the colonists used by the British.
