
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First English Colonies Crossword Puzzle

- 7 An English geographer who urged England to start a colony in the Americas.
- 8 In 1619 it became the first representative assembly in the American colonies.
- 11 A written contract issued by a government, giving the holder the right to establish a colony.
- 13 When the colonists ate rats, mice, snakes, cats, dogs, and horses in order to survive.
- 14 England began establishing colonies after the they defeated this in 1588.
- 16 This colony was named after Queen Elizabeth I.
- 18 He granted charters to the Virginia Company of Plymouth and the Virginia Company of London.
- 19 A piece of ownership of a company.
- 20 A Native American tribe that the colonists in Jamestown traded with. They also fought with them.
