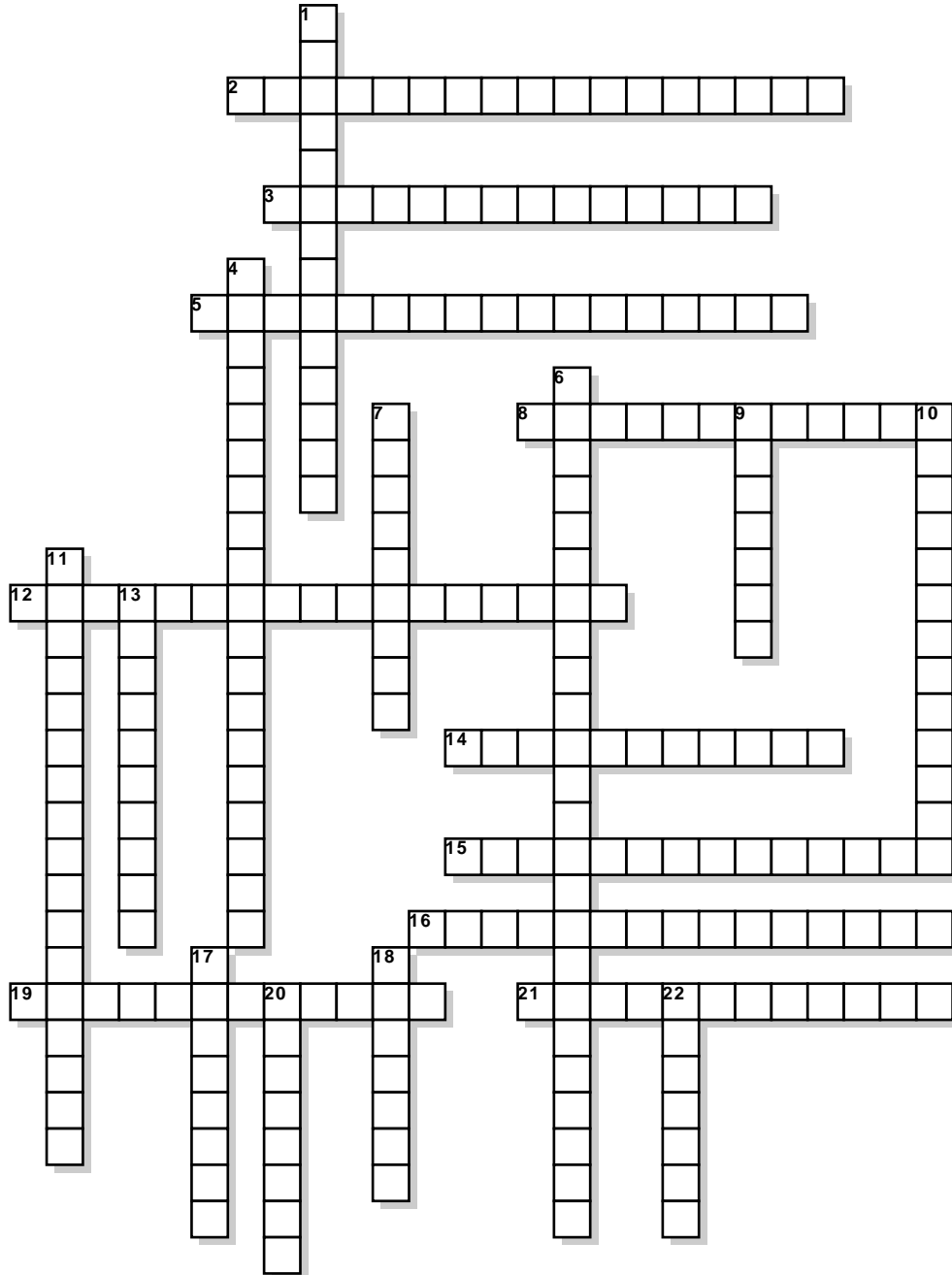


Lexington and Concord Crossword Puzzle

- 2 It had the power to call out the militia. John Hancock headed it.
- 3 From its steeple Paul Revere warned the people of Charlestown that the British were coming.
- 5 He was appointed governor of Massachusetts to enforce the Intolerable Acts.
- 8 A patriot who helped warn colonists about British movements. He escaped British capture but had to turn back.
- 12 He later wrote that the colonial militia had fired "the shot heard 'round the world."
- 14 He was hiding out in Lexington with Sam Adams. General Gage ordered their arrests.
- 15 This event infuriated the British and led to the Intolerable Acts.
- 16 Laws passed by Parliament punishing Massachusetts for the Boston Tea Party.
- 19 It is celebrated every year in Massachusetts and Maine on the third Monday in April
- 21 The British name for the Intolerable Acts.

- 4 Sites of the first battles of the Revolutionary War.
- 6 Meeting held by the colonies in Philadelphia in 1774 to decide what to do about the problems with Britain.
- 7 A colonist who could be ready to fight at minute's notice.
- 9 A force of armed civilians who pledge to defend their community.
- 10 A secret organization of colonial rebels. They participated in the Boston Tea Party.
- 11 He commanded the colonial militia at Lexington.
- 13 A patriot who helped warn colonists about British movements. He was captured.
- 17 A colonist who was loyal to Britain.
- 18 A colonist who supported the colonial rebels.
- 20 He organized a spy network to keep watch over British activities.
- 22 The Massachusetts militia was storing arms and ammunition there.
