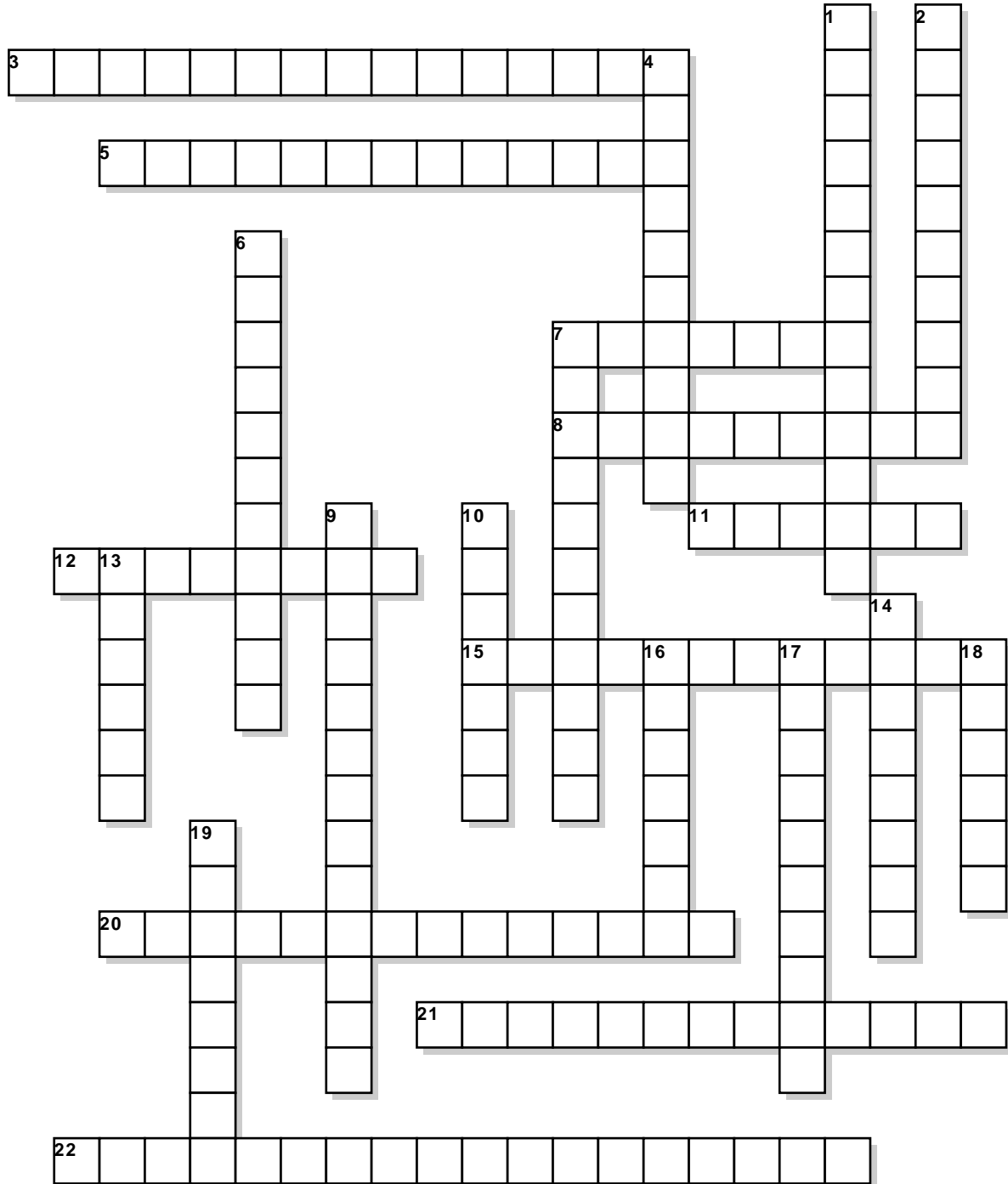


Southern Plantations and Slavery Crosswords

- 1 This body of water is in Maryland.
- 2 She introduced indigo as a successful plantation crop.
- 4 These became even stricter after the Stono Rebellion.
- 6 Large southern farms that grew cash crops.
- 7 He described the slave trade as "disgraceful to mankind."
- 9 One of the best known of the Southern planters from Virginia.
- 10 If a slave didn't work they would get this punishment.
- 13 A plant that yields a deep blue dye.
- 14 Baltimore was in this colony.
- 16 The most popularly grown cash crop in Maryland, Virginia, and North Carolina. You smoke it.
- 17 A big port city in South Carolina.
- 18 By 1750 they made up about 40% of the population.
- 19 Planters frequently used this against slaves to enforce their will.
