- 7: 1 square down, fifth row, middle.
- 8: 11 squares across, sixth row, left.
- 9: 8 squares down, seventh row, left.
- 10: 8 squares across, seventh row, middle.
- 11: 1 square down, eighth row, middle.
- 12: 8 squares across, eighth row, right.
- 13: 8 squares down, ninth row, right.
- 14: 4 squares across, tenth row, left.
- 15: 6 squares across, tenth row, middle.
- 16: 10 squares across, eleventh row, middle.
- 17: 6 squares across, twelfth row, middle.
- 18: 8 squares across, thirteenth row, middle.
- 19: 8 squares across, fourteenth row, left.

Across

- 1 Usually the second title of an article.
- 4 To exaggerate ex. He was as tall as a skyscraper.
- 5 Located at the back of a textbook and lists each section or topic found in the book with its page number.
- 6 Tells what the article is about.
- 8 Located in front of a book that lists units, chapters, stories or sections in the order that they appear in the book.
- 10 Gives the reader information or an idea about something that is going to happen later in the story.
- 14 The message the author wants to deliver.
- 15 A picture to help with the understanding of information.
- 16 An opinion that describes an entire group of people.
- 17 Words that are written with slanting letters.
- 18 A small dictionary in the back of the book.
- 19 When the author suddenly interrupts the flow of the story to jump back to earlier events.

- 2 A sequence of events or a person or place in time.
- 3 Curved marks () used in writing.
- 7 Words that are written darker than others.
- 9 Information given at the bottom of a selection to help the reader understand words or terms.
- 11 The formation of a word from a sound associated with what is named. Ex - cuckoo, sizzle, swish.
- 12 Introduces the main idea of the section that follows.
- 13 The facts, ideas, or claims used to persuade people to support a particular opinion or course of action. ex. advertising, slogans.
