- 6: Middle-right vertical word, 2 squares.
- 7: Middle-right vertical word, 6 squares.
- 8: Middle-left horizontal word, 4 squares.
- 9: Middle-right vertical word, 4 squares.
- 10: Bottom-left horizontal word, 4 squares.
- 11: Bottom-middle horizontal word, 6 squares.
- 12: Bottom-left horizontal word, 4 squares.
- 13: Bottom horizontal word, 8 squares.

- 1 10 ones and 5 ones.
- 4 One more than four; one less than six.
- 5 Used to compare two numbers when the first number is larger than the second number.
- 8 The ordinal number matching the number four in a position or order of things. After second and third in a sequence.
- 10 The ordinal number matching the number five in a position or order of things. After third and fourth in a sequence.
- 11 The ordinal number matching the number one. Before all the others in position or order.
- 12 Smaller quantity or amount.
- 13 10 ones and 4 ones.

- 2 One more than three; one less than five.
- 3 A number sentence with an equal sign. The amount on one side of the equal sign has the same value as the amount on the other side.
- 4 Smooth and even. (ex. Plane shapes; 2-dimensional shapes.)
- 6 A chart that shows mathematical information.
- 7 A mathematical phrase without an equal sign.
- 9 Having a weight that is greater than that of another object.
- 10 5 sets of 10 ones.
