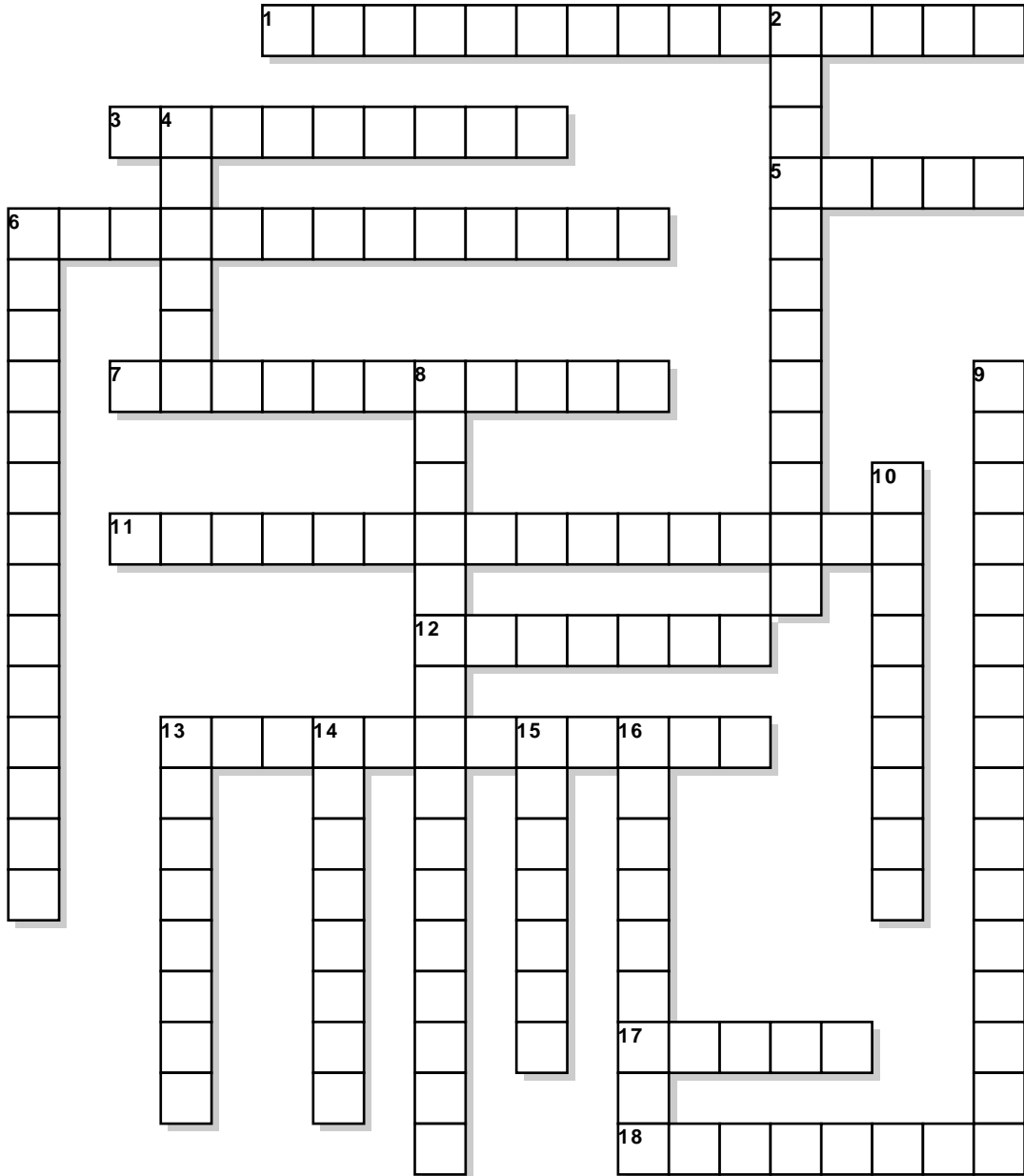


Figurative Language Crossword Puzzle

- 1 A type of metaphor in which non-human things possess human qualities or actions.
- 3 Repetition of vowel sounds or "internal rhyme".
- 5 Saying or doing the opposite of what you actually mean.
- 6 The audience knows information that the character(s) involved does not.
- 7 What is said is the opposite of what is meant.
- 11 The outcome of a situation is opposite of what was expected.
- 12 Any word or phrase applied to a person or thing to describe an actual or attributed quality. For example, "Richard the Lion-Hearted."
- 13 Words that imitate the sounds they refer to.
- 17 An expression that has developed over time and is distinct to a certain group of people.
- 18 A direct comparison of two unlike things.

Down

- 2 The repetition of consonant sounds at the beginning of neighboring words.
- 4 A comparison of two unlike things using like or as.
- 6 A comparison made directly using the word "is" ; for example: Life is a river.
- 8 A comparison that is not overt or direct. For example: The river of life.
- 9 A direct comparison of two unlike things that continues throughout a series of sentences or lines.
- 10 An obvious and deliberate exaggeration.
- 13 Two words that contradict each other, but together form one meaning.
- 14 A metaphor in which one word or phrase is substituted for another with which it is closely associated. For example, "crown" for "royalty."
- 15 A statement that contradicts itself, yet actually reveals some truth.
- 16 A polite way of saying something that may be sad, unpleasant, or shocking.
